To implement, monitor, assess and spread innovative and demonstrative actions that significantly improve current strategies against illegal poisoning in the EU. Halting the loss of biodiversity caused by the illegal use of poisoned baits at EU level, contributing to the objectives of the European Commission Communication “Halting the loss of biodiversity by 2010- and beyond”.

To significantly improve the conservation status of endangered species affected by the illegal use of poison at EU level (see form B2c), especially of those whose first non-natural cause of death is illegal poisoning.

To supply environmental sector administrations, companies, NGO's and other environmental institutions and stakeholders associations with high quality tools and resources to effectively fight against illegal poisoning. These tools are oriented to provide both a high level of autonomy to users and a high level of sustainability to the anti-illegal poisoning actions.

To develop monitoring methodologies and indicators to test the actions developed.

To obtain a series of contrasted indicators that allows assessing the tendencies in the use of poisoned baits at a given spatial-temporal scale in the EU.

To increase knowledge, motivation, participation and commitment of stakeholders and target collectives from European rural areas, in the fight against illegal poisoning.
